The Obedience Corner

"The Importance and Value of Absolute Respect"

Training dogs and helping other people train their dogs has been a passion of mine for over 40 years. I was very fortunate to have been exposed to a very sound, reliable method of training early on. My dog training mentors were Jack Godsil and Bob Self Sr., and I have modeled my training methods after what I learned from them.

Jack and Bob traveled all over the country delivering weekend training clinics. They also offered weeklong summer school sessions during the summer. Over the course of a number of years, I attended two dozen or so of their seminars and clinics. I loved watching Jack train dogs-both his own and those belonging to others. Jack was the most gifted dog trainer I have ever known. He commanded dogs' respect and attention instantly, and produced confident, happy attitudes in the dogs he trained. Bob was also a fine dog trainer, but would often laugh and say he did not possess Jack's lightning fast reflexes. Bob was an exemplary teacher, and excelled at imparting his knowledge to others.

One of the most important things I learned from Jack and Bob was that obedience is dependent on respect-absolute respect. Earning a dog's respect requires clearly communicating our expectations, and the consequences of not meeting those expectations; consistently requiring the same responses from the dog; and consistently rewarding the desired behavior.
